The greater part would be in the saving of wagon transportation, a saving in vehicles, a saving in horses, a saving in time, a saving in labor, a saving in risks, a saving in markets." 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QUESTIONS.

A gentleman at Bates signing himself "A Democrat" asks the following questions:

When was the first treaty made between the United States and China, and under whose administration, and who was the first minister to China from the United States?

In 1843, under the administration of President Tyler, (the Whig vice president who became president at the death of William Henry Harrison,) Caleb Cushing was sent as Envoy Extraordinary, etc., to establish the future commercial relations between the United States and the Chinese Empire on terms of national reciprocity.

What are the principal articles of import from China to this country, and the amount of duty derived from said imports?

The principal articles of import from China are tea, rice, sugar and porcelain. Tea is on the free list. The average duty on silk is about 35 per cent, rice 75 per cent, sugar (more of consequence imported), porcelain 60 per cent. For the year 1890 the duty paid on the imports of China, was approximately \$3,000,000, the total value of imports that year being \$6,200,471. Of this \$11,223,805 came in free of duty being nearly altogether tea.
