TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Assessors Meet.

SALISBURY, Oct. 20.—The county assessors of Oregon met here today and organized. It was decided to have a permanent association. George Sears, of Multnomah county, was made chairman, and D. D. Coffey secretary. Members of the state board of equalization were made honorary members. Committees were appointed to prepare a uniform form for assessment-roll books, also to urge county courts to provide assessors with abstracts and maps. Assessor York, of Yamhill, introduced a resolution asking that a law be enacted providing for deduction of indebtedness and taxation of mortgages. This was laid on the table. The assessors will meet again tomorrow with the board of equalization.

A Crazy City.

SPOKANE, Dec. 20.—Passengers returning to Spokane from the first round trip over the Spokane & Northern, report the arrival of the first through train at Nelson Tuesday evening was the signal for the wildest kind of demonstration that town has ever known. The entire population turned out. Liquid refreshments flowed lavishly. When the passengers alighted decorated buses were waiting them, and took them over the town. A merry crowd followed the procession through the streets, making a tremendous din. Everything was free in Nelson, and most of the citizens in town stayed all night.

Arrested Gully.

ROSENBERG, Dec. 20.—The trial of ex-County Treasurer Arrington, which has been going on for the past week, went to the jury this morning. After being out half an hour they returned a verdict of guilty as per indictment, and recommended him to the mercy of the court. Arrington was indicted for larceny of between \$22,000 and \$23,000 public money. The defense has moved for a new trial.

A Big Endowment.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 20.—Mrs. Jane Stanford, widow of the late Senator Leeland Stanford, and executrix of his vast estate, yesterday confirmed the telegraphic report that she had bequeathed to the city \$1,000,000 from one of the brothers of the late senator. In the latter's will \$300,000 is bequeathed his brother Thomas Weston Stanford, of Melbourne, Australia. This bequest has been turned over to the university.

Must Register.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 20.—Collector Welborn has received his instructions under the new act. He is ordered to give public notice at once to the Chinese that they must register, and is allowed 27 deputies.
