

CASCADE RESERVE.

Through the kindness of Hon R A Miller, the register of the U S Land office at Oregon City we are enabled to lay before our readers the proclamation of the president setting apart the great reserve of public lands in the Cascade mountains.

The Cascade Range Timber Reserve extends from the Cascade Locks on the Columbia river to within 20 miles of the Columbia line. For 15 miles it is about 30 miles wide, and for 35 miles, between Diamond Peak and Mt Pitt, it is 60 miles wide, embracing the summit and slopes of the Cascade range and comprising 4,500,000 acres. The reserve is larger than was necessary. Though the bill was introduced in congress with the object to secure the timber on such reserve, many sections included have been surveyed and have settlers on them.

The following is the president's proclamation:

WHEREAS It is provided by section 24 of the act of congress approved March 3d, 1891, entitled, "An act to repeal timber culture laws, and for other purposes," "That the president of the United States may, from time to time, set apart and reserve, in any state or territory having public land bearing forests, in any part of the public lands wholly or in part covered with timber or undergrowth, whether of commercial value or not, as public reservations, and the president shall, by public proclamation, declare the establishment of such reservations and the limits thereof;"

AND WHEREAS, The public lands in the state of Oregon, within the limits hereinafter described, are in part covered with timber, and it appears that the public good would be promoted by setting apart and reserving said lands as a public reservation.

Now, therefore, I, Grover Cleveland, president of the United States, by virtue of the power in me vested by section 24 of the aforesaid act of congress, do hereby make known and proclaim that there is hereby reserved from entry or settlement and set apart as a Public Reservation, all those certain tracts, pieces or parcels of land lying and being situated in the state of Oregon and particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the meander corner at the intersection of the range line between ranges 6 and 7 east, township 2 north, W M, Oregon, with the mean high-water mark on the south bank of the Columbia river in said state; thence northeasterly along said mean high-water mark to its intersection with the township line between townships 2 and 3 north; thence easterly along said township line to the northeast corner of township 2 north, range 8 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 8 and 9 east, to the southwest corner of township 2 north, range 9 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 8 and 9 east, to the southwest corner of township 1 north, range 9 east; then easterly along the Base Line to the northeast corner of township 1 south, range 10 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 10 and 11 east, to the southeast corner of township 4 south, range 10 east; thence westerly along the township line between townships 4 and 5 south, to the southwest corner of township 4 south, range 9 east; thence southerly along the west boundary of township 5 south, range 9 east, to its intersection with the west boundary of the Warm Springs Reservation; thence southerly along said Indian reservation boundary to the southwest corner of said reservation; thence southerly along the south boundary of said Indian reservation to a point on the north line of section 3, township 12 south, range 9 east, where said boundary crosses the township line between townships 11 and 12 south, range 9 east; thence easterly to the northeast corner of township 12 south, range 9 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 9 and 10 east, to the southeast corner of township 13 south, range 9 east; thence westerly along the Third Standard Parallel South, to the northeast corner of township 14 south, range 9 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 9 and 10 east, to the southeast corner of township 15 south, range 9 east; thence easterly along the Third Standard Parallel South, to the northeast corner of township 16 south, range 9 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 9 and 10 east, to the southeast corner of township 20 south, range 9 east; thence easterly along the Fourth Standard Parallel South, to the northeast corner of township 21 south, range 9 east; thence

southerly along the range line between ranges 9 and 10 east, to the southeast corner of township 23 south, range 9 east; thence westerly along the township line between townships 23 and 24 south, to the southeast corner of township 23 south, range 6 east; thence southerly along the range line between ranges 6 and 7 east, to the southwest corner of township 25 south, range 7 east; thence westerly along the Fifth Standard Parallel South, to the point for the northwest corner of township 26 south, range 7 east; thence southerly along the surveyed and unsurveyed west boundaries of townships 25 south, 27, 28, 29 and 30 south, to the southwest corner of township 30 south, range 7 east; thence westerly along the surveyed and unsurveyed west boundaries of townships 31, 32 and 33 south, range 7 1/2 east, to the southwest corner of township 33 south, range 7 1/2 east; thence easterly along the township line between townships 33 and 34 south, to the northeast corner of township 34 south, range 6 east; thence southerly along the east boundaries of townships 34 and 35 south, range 6 east, to the point of intersection of the east boundary of township 35 south, range 6 east with the west shore of Upper Klamath Lake; Continued to-morrow.
