## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

### A Big Battle.

LONDON, Jan 9.—The Libson correspondent forwards the following mail advices brought from Rio by the steamship Clyde, under date of December 26. An important battle has been fought in the state of Sao Paulo, in which the government troops, under General Argollo, were defeated by the insurgents. There were 10,000 troops engaged in the battle. Five hundred of the government forces were killed and the rest were taken prisoners. Among the captured are Generals Silva and Tella.

### Didn't Enter.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan 9.—A band of 62 Chinese were brought from Texas yesterday en route to China, and placed on the steamer Gaelic, which sailed this afternoon for Hong Kong. The band were captured while attempting to cross the border line from Mexico. Armed men guarded all the gangplanks of the steamer and kept watch over the Chinese quarters.

### Drowned While Skating.

TACOMA, Jan 9.—John Carl Sorenson, aged 15 years, and Charles O. Davis, aged 16, were drowned in Hood Canal lake this afternoon by the ice breaking on which they were skating. The bodies were both recovered. Mary Davis, the younger boy's sister, was married today at 2 P. M. The boy attended the ceremony, and soon after leaving the house met his tragic death.

### Lost Likit.

VANCOUVER, Wash. Jan 9.—There is a universal feeling of regret and disappointment, regardless of party affiliations, here over the failure of J. A. Munday to secure the appointment of collector of internal revenue. Munday's turn-down is looked upon here as one of the hardest blows the democracy has received in Washington.

### Saliva Knocked Out.

BUFFALO, Jan 9.—The story of John L. Full's latest knock-out has just leaked out. Saturday night John went out to "do the town." He drank heavily, and soon after returning to his hotel a great crash was heard in his room. John's wife had chased him, and he, in return, had assaulted her. She defended herself with an Indian club, knocking her husband senseless.

### A Chinook.

WALLA WALLA, Jan 9.—The snow, which accumulated to a depth of 12 inches since January 1, is going off with a rush tonight. A chinook has been blowing all afternoon and this evening a heavy warm wind set in.
