FACTS VS THEORY

To bring the foregoing stated facts more completely to the attention, and to photograph them, as it were, to the eye, it is only necessary to make a comparison of the average prices of these wools, as recorded in this table for the different periods, and present the result in tabulated form, thus giving a comprehensive view of the whole question, and exhibiting a condition and state of facts that no theory of protection can account for or ignore.

First and last year of each period indicated, included

Table with columns: FINE, Jan, Apr, July, Oct. Rows showing wool prices for various grades.

Table with columns: MEDICINE, Jan, Apr, July, Oct. Rows showing medicine prices.

Table with columns: COARSE, Jan, Apr, July, Oct. Rows showing coarse wool prices.

The prices for the period from 1862 to 1878 given in currency in the table, is reduced to coin rates in foregoing estimates.

This average of prices discloses that fine wool maintained higher rates in the market from 1851 to 1860 than any of the other periods with which the comparison is made.

Medium wool averaged higher for 1851 to 1860 than from 1836 to 1846, slightly lower than from 1824 to 1833 and from 1861 to 1874.

The price of coarse wools ruled higher from 1850 to 1860 than through either of the previous periods, and slightly lower than the average of either of the two which succeeded it.

It should be noted that in this long period of years there occurred some circumstances of flux and depression times which might be expected to influence the range of prices. Thus there were flush times from 1828 to 1833, already referred to.

Again there was a severe crisis in 1857 just after the passage of the lowest tariff of the period followed by a continued depression of some four years; but wool prices did not decline until 1861. Then came the war period which caused an enormous rise in all domestic products.

From the fact here given, drawn from sources of unquestioned and established accuracy, it can be affirmed with absolute certainty that during the 70 years, since wool

was placed on the dutiable list, domestic wools have brought better prices under the lower, than they have under the higher rates of duty.
