France will soon adopt an interesting innovation in the postal card system. The cards will be issued in the form of check books with stubs. The sender of the postal card can make memoranda of its contents on the stub, and can have this stamped at the postoffice before the card is detached, so that a verified record of the correspondence can be kept.

A large part of the sulphur of commerce comes from Sicily, where it occurs in large quantity in the native condition upon the slope of Mount Etna. 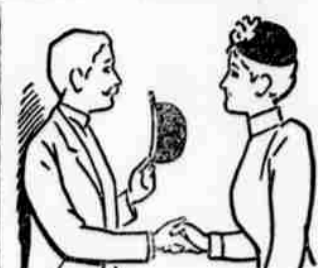
