

FREED TRADE

The resolution of the Iowa Millers' association to petition congress to "throw open all American ports so that the millers can get their products into foreign ports" is an open declaration in favor of free trade.

The mean annual rainfall (rain and melted snow) at Portland Oregon is 49.8 inches.
