THE TAX ON INCOMES.

Since the passage of the income tax law by congress seems reasonably certain, its far reaching effects upon the millionaires of New York and Brooklyn have been inquired into.

John D Rockefeller's, 6 per cent; Wm Waldorf Astor's, 7 per cent; Jay Gould's estate, which being wrapped up in corporations is still practically undivided, 4 per cent; Cornelius Vanderbilt, 5 per cent, and Wm K Vanderbilt, 5 per cent.

Calculating at the foregoing rates, and compounding the interest semiannually to allow for investment, the yearly and daily incomes of the four individuals and of the estates named are as follows:

John D Rockefeller, worth \$10,000,000, invested in "gold edged" securities, and in furthering various enterprises.

William Waldorf Astor, worth \$120,000,000, inherited through intermediate generations.

Russel Sage, worth \$90,000,000. Mr Sage can, it is said, lay his hand on more ready money than any other man in America.

Jay Gould estate, \$100,000,000, now practically under the management of his sons, the oldest of whom is George J. Gould.

Cornelius Vanderbilt, \$80,000,000, inherited his wealth from Wm H Vanderbilt his father.

Wm K Vanderbilt has a fortune of \$75,000,000. Income, \$3,790,000; income tax, \$79,900.

Henry M Flagler, worth \$60,000,000, made in the production of petroleum and in refining the oil and transporting it.

Frederick W Vanderbilt, worth \$35,000,000. Annual income, \$1,750,000; daily income, \$4,794; income tax, \$35,000.

John Jacob Astor, worth \$50,000,000. Nearly all his fortune is invested and is being constantly reinvested in real estate.

Louis C Tiffany, worth \$35,000,000, made by the manufacturer and sale of jewelry.

Collis P Huntington, worth \$20,000,000 made in building and managing the Central Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads.

Wm Rockefeller, worth \$60,000,000, made in petroleum. Annual income, \$1,000,000; daily income, \$2,729; income tax, \$20,000.

Mrs Elliott F Shepard, worth \$20,000,000 inherited \$10,000,000 from her father, Wm H Vanderbilt and owns much stock in the Vanderbilt system of railroads.

Mrs Hetty Green, worth \$10,000,000 one of the richest women of the globe. Saves her money carefully. She is a sharp, close business woman and has greatly increased her fortune by shrewd investments.

Moses Taylor estate, \$50,000,000, made in importing sugar from Cuba. The annual income from the estate is, it is estimated, \$2,500,000; daily income, \$6,849; income tax, \$50,000.

Robert Goelet worth \$25,000,000, inherited from the Goelet family. Invested in real estate. Annual income, \$1,250,000; daily income, \$3,425; income tax, \$25,000.

Ogden Goelet, worth \$20,000,000 property inherited from the Goelet family and constantly increasing in value. Annual income, \$1,000,000; daily income, \$2,729; income tax, \$20,000.

I M Singer estate estimated to be worth \$30,000,000 made in the sewing machine business. Annual income, \$1,500,000; daily income, \$4,109; income tax, \$30,000.

J Pierpont Morgan of Drexel, Morgan & Co, worth \$25,000,000. Annual income, \$1,250,000; daily income, \$3,425; income tax, \$25,000.

David Dow's estate, worth \$20,000,000, made in railroads, banking and grain. Annual income \$1,000,000; daily income \$2,729; income tax, \$20,000.
