SEAN CAGANITY.

The Oregonian a few days ago published a dispatch from Washington purporting to give a conversation held between two prominent democrats, (very wisely concealing their names,) one being a member of the democratic national committee and the other a prominent West Virginia democrat in which the latter was reported to be bawling the dire calamities to the coal and lumber interest in case the Wilson bill shall pass. He is reported as saying:

Our lumber and coal mining industries are threatened with practical annihilation, and Northern capital, which was beginning to invade the South, has been withdrawn, both because money is frightened by uncertainty of the times and because the proposed tariff legislation is in the line of reducing the attraction of capital to our timber and coal fields. In lumber we shall be thrown entirely out by competition with the Canadian product and in coal we are already being crowded by the Nova Scotia product. It is poorer coal, but is being laid down at 90 cents a ton less than ours. With the tariff taken off, with the Canadian advantage of cheap water transportation, West Virginia will not be able to mine coal at a profit with anything but starvation wages.

It is sufficient to say that no democrat ever said such thing. No intelligent man would make it. A little investigation will fully verify this statement. Let us look in to this matter of importing coal from Nova Scotia and destroying the coal interests of West Virginia. If the United States can send coal now to Nova Scotia and sell it in competition with the coal of that country, what danger can there be in removing the duty from coal? None whatever. This proposition is too plain to be controverted. Well, then, for the year ending December 31st, 1893, there were imported into the United States from all foreign countries 1,108,611 tons of bituminous coal, (the kind upon which the duty is placed.) Of this 648,992 was from the entire dominion of Canada. Probably the half of this was from Nova Scotia. During the same period we exported of the same kind of coal 2,325,591 tons or more than twice the amount we imported. Then where can be the danger of removing the duty from coal? There is but one danger and that is that such removal may operate to deprive the coal barons of the country of the power to form and perpetuate coal combines and trusts whereby they are enabled to wring exorbitant prices for their product from the people. But among the people this would be a consumption devoted to be wished. A very significant fact connected with this matter of the amount of coal exported from the United States to foreign countries is the one that nearly half of it, (994,891 tons,) was shipped to the dominion of Canada, to compete with whose coal our coal barons fear so much to undertake. The same is true of lumber and the manufacture of wood imported for the period above mentioned was \$14,789,963 and of that exported was \$26,359,195. So it will be seen that we export more coal and wood manufactures than we import and hence that it is pure nonsense to have any fear of competition from importations.

The Senate is reading the American people a very impressive lesson on the virtual irresponsibility of our whole system of national legislation, and is more over showing the dangers that adhere to the intrusting of great issues to the keeping of a body of men who are living in ease in Washington. The national capital is becoming one of the most beautiful cities in the world, and the leisure with which it is enveloped as with a garment does not detract from its charm. But the less a lawmaker becomes a Washingtonian the more likely he is to have a clear conception of his duty to the American people. Their voice appears to reach Washington in tones more or less muffled.

Representatives Jerry Simpson of Kansas is out in an interview advocating the nomination of Senator William V. Allen of Nebraska for the presidency in 1896 by the Populists. He says Allen is the only man in the Populist ranks who comes fully up to the measure; that Senator Puffer of Kansas is a good and able man but too timid. He regards Senator Allen as the brainiest, nerveiest man in all the Populist party.

Duelling in Russia has become so very common that the government has been compelled to decree a code of punishment. If a duelist kills an antagonist, it will cost him six years in prison for severe wounding, the penalty will be three years; duel without injury, six months; provoking a duel, six weeks to three months.

The country at large without regard to party will be glad to learn that congressman Wilson, the author of the tariff bill and who has been so seriously ill in Mexico is now reported out of danger.

The third substitute seigniorage bill carried yesterday by 171 to 96. Its provisions are as follows: The first section of the substitute is identical with the first section of the original bill, except that coinage is to proceed as fast as "possible" instead of "practicable." The substitute for the second section is as follows: "After the coinage provided for in the first section, the seigniorage remaining of silver bullion purchased in pursuance of the act of July 14, 1890, shall be coined into legal tender standard silver dollars as fast as possible, and the coin shall be held for redemption of treasury notes issued against such bullion. As fast as the bullion shall be coined for redemption, said notes shall not be redeemed but shall be cancelled in amounts equal to coin held derived from the coinage herein provided for, and silver certificates shall be issued on such coin in the manner now provided for by law."

"Provided this act shall not be construed to change the existing law relating to the legal tender character of made of redemption of existing treasury notes under the act of 1892. A sufficient sum is appropriated to carry into effect the provisions of this act."

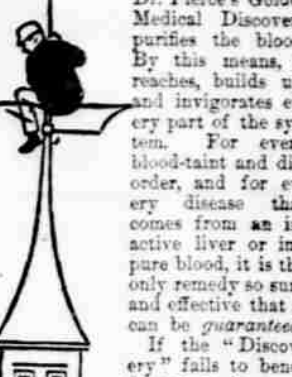
