The grangers of Marion county have adopted the following resolution:

Resolved by Marion county convention that we hereby endorse the principle of the Initiative and Referendum as far as it is applicable under the constitution and if not applicable that the constitution be so amended that it do apply to all general legislation in future.

This is so strongly in accord with the democratic idea of retaining the largest power possible in the hands of the people that we hesitate not to give it our endorsement.

Bryan of Nebraska has introduced in the house a bill to construe the law which gives the secretary of the treasury right to redeem coin obligations in gold or silver at his discretion. It provides that all obligations incurred by the government, whether they bear interest or not, which, according to their terms call for payment in coin, shall be payable in gold or silver at the discretion of the secretary of the treasury, and that the right of the holder to demand payment in any particular kind of coin is expressly denied. The secretary of the treasury is directed to maintain gold and silver coin on a parity, upon the present legal ratio or such ratio as may be provided by law, by receiving the same without discrimination against either metal in payment of all public dues, customs and taxes.

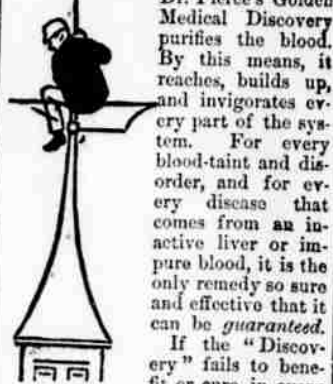
