TELEGRAPHIC.

A Fatal Avalanche.

WALLACE, Idaho, March 30.—The names of the persons killed in the snow slide in Canyon creek yesterday were Stefan Deiro, aged 29; his wife, aged 25; their daughter Victoria, aged 5; Martino Michele, aged 24, all Italians, and Mrs. Nellie Rowe. The bodies of the two men have not yet been found. Arthur Swayne was so terribly injured that his recovery is uncertain. Fully 200 miners are at work shoveling the snow and searching for the bodies.

A Whiskey Fight.

New York, March 31.—The Herald's Columbia, S. C. special says: In a fight today between the militia and the whiskey cronies on one side and citizens on the other, three persons were killed. The citizens then got the upper hand and drove the state police, 22 men, into the swamp. The first serious trouble took place at the station of the Columbia, Sumter & North-ester railroad, and this is where the slaughter took place.

Breckinridge Condemned.

LEXINGTON, March 30.—The move which was on foot among the women to get up a petition condemning Colonel Breckinridge, has been stopped by the publication of the movement. Letters were written to Colonel Breckinridge's friends and counsel, in which they say action should not be taken on the testimony of Miss Pollard. They deny that they have signed a petition to congress, but denounce Colonel Breckinridge.

A Chinaman Robbed.

TACOMA, March 30.—Late last night a Chinaman from Walla Walla, who was bound for China, was snatched and robbed of nearly \$700. He was on the way to the home of a friend, when four men set upon him. He was found by the police and removed to a hospital in an unconscious condition. There is no clue to his assailants.

Damage to the Wheat Crop.

ATCHISON, March 30.—The superintendent of the Missouri Pacific has received reports concerning the wheat crop from all stations in Eastern Kansas and Nebraska. They indicate that the wheat is being injured in Kansas, although it is too early to tell definitely. In Nebraska the reports indicate slight damage.
