Rev. L. D. Beck, financial agent of Mineral Springs College, returned Saturday from a visit to Yamhill county and Yaquina Bay. He reports that the college endowment fund is growing nicely, subscriptions to date amounting to \$7,000. After he succeeds in raising \$10,000 in this state, Rev. The little fellow went down once and after coming to the surface floated down stream, and was not strangled at all by going down. Spain Accepts.

Today Spain formally accepted the terms of peace proposed by the United States in full, and this will end hostilities as soon as the news can be gotten to our forces. Peace commissioners will be appointed preparatory to the final treaty of peace. Declaration of war was made on April 23, and peace terms accepted 3 months and 13 days afterwards.

Music and drawing is also taught. The tuition is free. All students pay an incidental fee of ten dollars yearly. Board, lodging, heat and light in the dormitory cost \$2.50 per week.

WAR NEWS.

New York, Aug. 6.—The Journal's Madrid correspondent reiterates former statement Spain accepts peace terms.

Weyler opposes, but says insurgents will prove America's curse.

Madrid, Aug. 6.—Blackco implorers home government to continue war.

The Danger Faced

WASHINGTON, Aug. 5.—The officers are greatly relieved to know from the Santiago dispatches that what appears to have been a great danger to the American army has been safely passed by.

The reports of the American command-generals and division and brigade commanders, which were made public in newspaper dispatches yesterday, gave, for the first time, to the public the news of the terribly demoralized condition of the American army.

Troubles of their Own

LONDON, Aug. 5.—There is great uneasiness on all sides in regard to the Chinese solution, which is regarded as bringing an open conflict between Great Britain and Russia within measurable distance, and it is universally felt that the Marquis of Salisbury, in yielding to Russia's aggressiveness, is responsible for a dangerous complication which can only be over come by a prompt and most firm estimation that Russia's open opposition to British commercial concessions must cease.

Wanted to Surrender

ST. THOMAS, D. W. I., Aug. 5.—The Americans have taken peaceful possession of the eastern portion of the island. Small parties of mariners have been landed, who have lighted the lamps in the lighthouses at Cape San Juan and other lighthouses along the coast. They met with no resistance.

A Fight

NEW YORK, Aug. 5.—Jim Jeffries, the much heralded heavyweight pugilist from California, who was to have fought Bob Armstrong and Steve O'Donnell 10 rounds each before the Lenox Athletic Club tonight, but he was only able to carry out half his proposed task. He met Armstrong and defeated him, but in doing so shattered his left arm and was unable to meet O'Donnell.

NORFOLK, Va., Aug. 5.—The Merritt Wrecking Company has received advice that make it certain that the Infanta Maria Theresa is now floated, and is in fairly good condition as to her machinery and boilers.

Another Kind of War

CHICAGO, Aug. 5.—A passenger rate war that will affect directly every fare in the West has been declared.

The reductions made will affect not only St. Paul, Omaha and Kansas City traffic, but all that beyond there, the new fares being tendered as basing rates to connecting lines.
