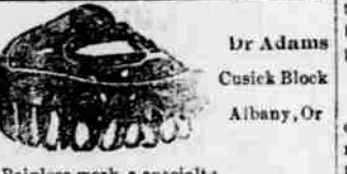

**SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.**

This has been a week in which talk of peace between the United States and Spain has predominated. It has now reached that place where it is business with a sharp point. Though there are to be some preliminaries, the prospects are remarkably good for peace, a consummation devoutly to be wished. In the settlement of the terms of the peace there seems to be a sentiment of many for the United States to lord it over Spain just because it is in a position to do so, but the DEMOCRAT is glad to notice a spirit on the part of the government to be reasonable in this respect. Just at this time it is impossible to be seen any politics in this. It is possible though that in time some one will jump up and figure some out of it. Just where it will fall it is impossible to tell now.

No nation was ever more thoroughly whipped than Spain has been and hence there is nothing else for it to do but to plead for peace.

In the mean time very wisely the American forces have been proceeding just the same as if there were no negotiations pending at all.

They now say Camara's fleet was useless anyway. This has taken a long time to find out. The DEMOCRAT doesn't claim to be very smart, but it has been satisfied right along that it didn't amount to very much and stated a long time ago that it would like to have it go on to drive Dewey out of Manila harbor. Had it done so there would have been two fleets at the bottom of that harbor where the Albany boys are located instead of one and the second one would have been Camara's just as sure as apples grow on apple trees.

Locally we have been greatly interested in receiving some very interesting letters from the young men of this city who are at Manila to help protect our interests there. These letters are read with avidity, for every loyal citizen desires to be thoroughly posted about the doings of the boys there. The DEMOCRAT is very glad to give space to them, and it will always consider it a privilege to be able to publish them that our readers generally may know just what the boys are seeing and how they are living.

In the matter of crops the harvest is sufficiently along to know about what the situation is. The facts seem to be that the pestiferous aphid has done some damage, considerable in some places, and that the severe heat of last week injured the spring grain some, and yet on account of the increased acreage the total crop will be a good one. It is to be regretted that the prospect for a good price is less.

An incident of the week was a very concerted letter of Col. Roosevelt to Secretary Alger in which he took occasion to remark that the rough riders were far superior to the volunteers, whereupon Secretary Alger answered him very curtly stating that they were not but that their arms were. The DEMOCRAT is not an admirer of Alger but in this case his answer was most timely. The splendid showing made by the rough riders before Santiago seems to have given some of them the big head, particularly their Colonel. A good soldier should be modest in his demeanor, and not a braggadocio. Roosevelt as brave as he may be seems to have been considerable of a brag, displaying a spirit that is out of place.

Professor Charles F. Johnson writes to the Hartford Conrant about Admiral Sampson. "What he says is interesting. Schley, who was "straightforward, honorable, slightly impulsive, would not dream of comparing his scientific attainments to those of Sampson, nor indeed were there any other officers, with one or two exceptions, in the same class with him in that respect."
