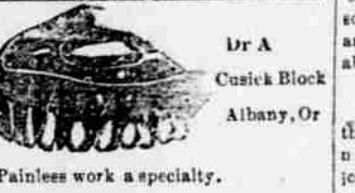

America The World Feeder.

From the World.
 The figures of our foreign commerce for the fiscal year ending June 30 are eloquent and instructive.
 Our total exports exceeded \$1,230,000,000—a record breaking figure. Of these the products of agriculture exported amounted to \$854,627,929, an increase of more than \$170,000,000 over the figures of the preceding year.
 Of the total increase in our exports, which was almost wholly of agricultural products, the increase to European countries was \$160,000,000. These customers of ours took altogether \$973,699,289 of our products. So much is "abroad" to us!

In other words we feed Europe. In spite of the hostility of Germany and France to the American hog, and in spite of every kind of petty opposition to and persecution of our exporting industry, we are still the world's granary and the source of its food supply.
 Any interruption in this supply would mean a disturbance of values and prices in every European market such as few European governments could stand. The result would be the absolute hunger of the working classes, of the bread-winners and of the bread-eaters. Riots and anarchy and the overturning of governments and dynasties would be the ultimate result of any long continued interruption of the American food supply.
 The peace and security of the United States are guaranteed by its crops. So long as our farmers furnish the military camps of Europe with their rations there is no danger of their disturbing the peaceful supremacy.

A great arch of roses, carnations and simlax, at the base of which were the words "at rest," was conspicuous among the floral emblems at the funeral in Concord, Mass., of Parker Pillsbury, the anti-slavery advocate. This was a tribute from the colored people of Boston and it was accompanied by a card which bore this inscription: "From that class of Americans in whom he recognized during an early and life long devotion that before man made us citizens, great nature made us men!"

The Kansas troops encamped at San Francisco are still troubled with a plethora of nightshirts sent to them by industrious wives, sisters and sweethearts. A lieutenant of the Twentieth writes: "Let the Kansas girls know that their nightshirts and pajamas are appreciated even if we cannot wear them for the purposes for which they were intended. I have a notion that when we get to Manila these garments will come in handy for an everyday dress. I have seen some pictures of Manila women who seem to be wearing a Mother Hubbard somewhat like three I have in my chest and I reckon Mother Hubbards are just about suited to the Manila climate."

The oldest newspaper in the world is the Tsing-Pao, or Peking News, founded in the year 710 A. D. Until quite recently it was supposed that the Kin Pan a Chinese journal published in Peking for the last 1,000 years, was the oldest newspaper in the world. In a very able work recently published, however Imbant Huart, the French consul at Canton shows that the high honor belongs to the Tsing-Pao, which has been published continuously since the year 710, and is even said to have been founded some 200 years before that date, or early in the sixteenth century, 800 years before a newspaper was known in Europe.

The driving of a bicycle at ten miles an hour has been ascertained to require about one twenty third of a horse power. An expert rider for a short time may exert one-third of a horse power.
