BARNUM PROVES HIS POWER OVER HYPNOTIC SUBJECTS

Baseball Game Awakes Interest; Prize Waltzers Source of Amusement.

Barnum, the hypnotist, scored heavily with the crowd at the Albany Theater last night when a dozen men placed under his influence and imagining themselves to be local baseball stars, gave an exhibition of the national game. Only the catcher and batter were on the stage, while the rest of the players were stationed through the audience. Only by putting the team to sleep at the critical moment did Barnum save the life of the umpire, who was threatened on all sides by indignant players. Ridiculous in the extreme was the prize waltz which concluded the program. With half of his subjects dressed as women, in styles that even the fashion plates of today would not duplicate, and the other half as men, appearing in travesties on evening dress, the dance began. One couple could not waltz, sorogged instead. Finally Barnum began awakening them, one at a time, and the dismay of the erstwhile ladies, on realizing the freakishness of their costumes brought heavy applause from the audience. Equally amusing stunts are promised by Barnum tonight.

WASHINGTON MAY VOTE AGAIN ON PROHIBITION

Olympia, Wash., January 11.—The state legislature convened here today. It is overwhelmingly Republican. The liquor question will take precedence over all other measures at this session. In November the people adopted statewide prohibition by the initiative method, and is scheduled to go dry January 1, 1915. The wets are seeking a special election before that date. They have drawn up an initiative bill to be presented to the legislature for adoption, providing that saloons shall be abolished, but breweries may continue to operate and that hotels having 50 rooms or more shall have the right to serve liquor to guests. Under the law, the legislature is bound to resubmit this question to the people, it is claimed, for the necessary signatures have been obtained. But it remains discretionary with the lawmakers whether there is to be a special election in 1915, or whether the measure shall wait until the regular election in November, 1916, eleven months after prohibition goes into effect.
