Cattle. This week's market opened steady to strong in all classes. Prime steers sold at \$8, cows at \$6.80 and other grades in proportion.

Hogs. With a beginning of \$6.80 Monday which was 15c over the close of last week, hogs have maintained this level, although all other American markets have shown a decided weakness.

North Portland being the highest by 10 cents.

Sheep. The strength of the sheep market has been able to bring somewhat increased receipts this week.

(By United Press Association) Denver, Jan. 29.—Feet talk! They are especially expressive when the average person is telling a falsehood. This is the conclusion reached by John A. Rush, district attorney at Denver, who is prosecutor of the county, has made a study of feet.

"Whenever a witness is on the stand," said Rush today, "I watch his feet. They are an index of the mind and come pretty close to telling whether a person is telling a falsehood. The first evidence of nervousness appears in the feet. A witness who is lying will shift his feet and become jerky and uneasy. Such evidences are invariably an indication that the witness either is not sure of his testimony or is not telling the truth."

or in response to personal inquiry at the Internal Revenue office, and it is most earnestly requested that returns be filed or information asked as early as possible so that more careful attention may be given to these details, thus avoiding any questions arising upon final expediting of the returns at Washington, D. C.

Remittances to the government for payment of taxes should be in the form of money order, bank draft or certified check. Collectors have specific instructions not to accept personal checks, unless marked by the bank on which they are drawn, and a departure from such instructions is a violation of the regulations governing the department.
