SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.

If we begin these thoughts with the leading event of the week it will be something about the war that will have to start the column, and, it looks now as if this will be the program for many months to come, perhaps for several years. Let us hope, though, for only a short time, for there can be but one wish in the world, and that is that the disagreeable quarrel may cease. In the events of the war the main attraction has been the progress of the ships of the allies toward Constantinople, bombarding the forts of the Dardanelles along the way, with report of a Russian fleet approaching on the other side. If Constantinople is taken it may have a material effect on the future of the war. It should be done without bombardment if possible, for it would be a blow to the entire world to have the many ancient landmarks of Constantinople destroyed.

The great Panama exposition continues to attract wide attention, drawing large crowds, said to be a show worth while, one deserving crowds from all over the country so long as visitors are treated white by San Francisco people; but woe to them if they take advantage of their guests with graft and bad usage.

Congress has adjourned, leaving a record without parallel in many respects, one of great things accomplished in the interest of the people, of pledges kept, and of conscientious adherence to duty. The result of the recent long session of congress will grow in importance as the years pass, putting a record on the pages of history which will long be referred to. The time will come when the work of President Wilson as a chief executive will be estimated at its true value, among the great administrations in the history of the United States.

Locally the importance of bringing people to this city as the trading center of the valley has been emphasized, in such ways as to call for a general movement looking to the commercial improvement of affairs. Getting people to come to Albany from a wide

range of territory will mean much in the future development of the city and its interests. United, harmonious effort is what counts, backed by the power of the press, pushing together with confidence for better conditions.

People differ about what is the best thing locally in the passing events of the week, looking at events through different colored glasses. The writer of these thoughts has always contended that there is nothing of more importance than character building. We may sometimes come pretty close to losing faith in manhood and womanhood as displayed in our experiences; but, after all we see so much that is good even in people making no great professions, that faith in our fellow men comes far from being destroyed. In fact there are some mighty good people in the world. The suggestion of this item is that it is the duty of all to help increase the number, making real character building a more important thing in the events of our lives.

An address on the selection of foods for our tables brought up the part that the things we eat play in our lives. When attention will be found to be of a good deal of concern, not only playing a part physically, but as well mentally and morally. A good or bad stomach has lots to do with one's temper and disposition, playing an important part in the lives of all.
