A CITY IMPROVEMENT.

It is sufficiently so to call for pavement where absolutely needed, as is the case in some parts of the city. Nothing is worse than a muddy street in a busy part of a city, thickly settled, and nothing is much more welcome than pavement that brings opposite sides of a street compactly together in the matter of interchange of trips, whether for business or socially.
