THE ROAD TO SUCCESS.

The following from the Big Brotherhood Farm Bulletin, published by Prof. Lyon, of Lebanon, is so full of good sense we give it a place in the Democrat: Genius has been defined as the capacity for hard work. The boy who plugs along, and works hard steadily and consistently at his work generally succeeds in the end. But there is something else every boy should stop to consider, and that is the training power of intense concentration of thought on the question in mind. The boy who plugs along steadily may not have acquired this habit and consequently he goes a long distance around to achieve his end. Genius is not so much the capacity for intense work. A world's call of the greatest men, will show at once that they had this capacity for intellectual concentration to a remarkable degree. Thomas A. Edison, inventor, is probably one of the most conspicuous examples of this power of thought concentration. When a great idea is on his mind he is so oblivious to all outside things, that he is scarcely conscious of what he eats or whether he eats at all. Moreover, he is capable of sustaining this intense concentration of thought for a long period of time. Sometimes for hours and days he eats, sleeps and dreams, with the idea until it has found birth in his mind. "I hardly know whether I am in the living world or not," he confesses. "At times it seems as if mind had such dominance over mat-

ter that the body is of little actual use. Napoleon had the capacity for intellectual concentration, for it is said, while sitting on horseback he could work out a most strategic problem, and while thus thinking he forgot his surroundings and officers and soldiers. He could even in the midst of a battle, with the shot and shell screaming around, lose himself so completely in deep concentration of thought that he was totally oblivious to all danger."

OLD BATTLESHIP IS TO BE BURNED FOR JUNK San Francisco, March 26.—The Independence, oldest American man-of-war afloat will be burned for the sake of the copper in her hull and other metal fixings. This decision has been reached by Capt. John H. Rinder of Berkeley, who recently purchased the vessel at auction for \$3515. The Independence is the last of the war frigates built for the war of 1812 with England and is one of the most famous ships the American navy ever boasted. Her keel was laid down in 1812. In her day she was to the United States navy what the most modern superdreadnaughts is to the navies of today. She was the greatest fighting vessel afloat, boasting three decks and 47 guns. Last year the navy department decided to sell the famous old vessel, in spite of the protests by patriotic societies in all parts of the country. Captain Rinder bought the frigate, intending to exhibit her at the Panama Pacific exposition, but the plans fell through.
