REAL HEROES IN LIFE.
The Democrat has just received a book from the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission, giving a list of the heroes who have received medals under the Carnegie fund, with an account of the incident that enabled the person to obtain the medal. It is interesting reading. The award besides offering a medal to the hero often has included \$500 to \$1000 for either the person or some one connected with it, who has suffered because of it. The work is one that appeals to one, a worthy way in which to spend some of a large fortune obtained by aid of the government. The real heroes in life, though, are not always the ones who get the medals, but often those who patiently and quietly perform their duty in life, living lives full of self-sacrifice, putting up with the quibbles of the world, forgetting wrongs, forgiving injuries, overlooking slights, passing along without resentment. No medals come their way, no big tips, no banquets in their honor, no special guest favors, just plain, clean living sweet lives besides which the roses have no odor.**GARDENING DAYS.**
These Spring days are the gardening time of the year. The person does well who takes heed of the fact and plants something, either extensively or sparingly, some kind of a garden resulting. Nothing in the world tastes better than things from one's own garden. Along this line is a neat bulletin just issued by the O. A. C., which is incorporated into this article. "In every school and community there should be at least one teacher who knows gardening, both theoretically and practically. This teacher should teach the elementary science in the schools during school hours and out of school hours direct the home gardening of children between the ages of seven and fifteen years." This is what Dr. P. P. Claxton, United States commissioner of education, says of one of the greatest movements that have taken place in Oregon's educational system during the present decade. It means better health and better study power for the child; better morality in the community, better living for the family, and some contribution to self support. Dr. Claxton thinks the effect of this contribution to self-support will be to keep the average child in school three or four years longer than he attends now, a very necessary thing, since education in citizenship for our industrial civic and social democracy cannot be gained previous to adolescence.
