PEACE TALK.
The Democrat has received another one of those peace letters from the Carnegie Endowment Peace Commission, headed by Rufus Choate.

"To cast our weak protest now among the tremendous forces that are urging on the great conflict would be futile; but the end of this war will come before long and then the great question will stand for answer: 'Shall the lesson be forgotten; the sacrifice lost?'

"Above all the motive and spirit of the new institutions should be clearly and fully, not the promotion of ambition or even the extension of power, but the safeguarding of human rights and the perfection of individual liberty.
