WE HAVE FREE LOCKS.

For a good many years a great deal has been said about free locks at Oregon City, the demand having been persistent. Now we have them, and we shall see what we shall see. In the past the benefits of the change have been pictured in glowing terms and men have sought preferment by advocacy of the important movement. Commercial clubs have displayed marked enthusiasm and politicians have annexed the locks to their platforms. The Democrat has always favored the movement. The locks should be free. At the same time there has been a "sneaking" suspicion that, as a matter of fact, the people will never see much benefit from it. On the face of it there should be a difference of 50 cents a ton. It will be very interesting to see whether in practice the people will get the 50 cents. It is to be hoped they do. Too often, though, the benefit in such cases goes to others. As the change is right and a matter of justice this is something that will have to take care of itself.

MAIL BY ELECTRICITY.

Something new under the sun is the electric mail. It is said that it is possible under a system by which as high as one thousand words a minute may be telegraphed. Under the proposed arrangement the electric letter will be sent by wire from one post office to another and delivered the same as other letters. The matter was brought up before congress and referred to a committee of the senate composed of Messrs. Bankhead, Chairman, Geo. E. Chamberlain, Luke Lea and Miles Poindexter. Senator Chamberlain submitted the report to the committee declaring the system to be worthy, suggesting experiments by the postmaster general. The system which is called the Telepost now sends matter for 25 cents for 25 words. The rate of the electric mail will be still lower. It is declared that should it be inaugurated it would involve no change in the system of the postal department. The cost from New York to Chicago for 50 words will be but 25 cents, ten words to cost ten cents. The cost across the continent will probably be a little more. The night letter has already proven a fine thing. The Democrat is not sufficiently familiar with the Telepost to know what there is in it, but the electric mail idea is one that appeals to one as a pretentious matter.
