AN ODD CHARACTER.

Mable Burson and Florence Dawson read selections, and Bell Burson

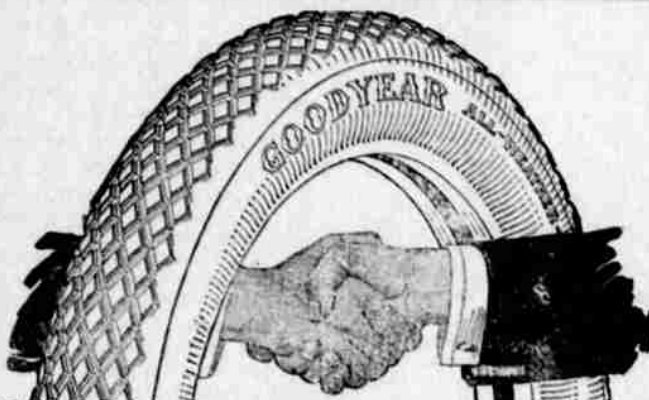
