Those who have come in close contact with her work in the Governor's office, and on the compensation commission, admit she has brought to bear a brain power that entitles her to high rank among the men in public service.

Quick and keen, quiet and tactful—those who really know what she has done and can do, take their hats off to her—not because it's polite to the gentler sex, but because of her real ability.

It is unfortunate that her introduction to the Oregon public should have been so spectacular. But that was not her fault. She was given a rough duty, and she discharged it gently and firmly.

The circumstance that she had been thrust in the limelight as the star figure in a gambling raid, coupled with the very apparent fact that she was a woman, was responsible in part for her being forced off the Compensation Commission. Another reason was that she was so loyal to Gov. West, her political dad. Anyone of these three reasons was cause for fighting her; combined, all three reasons furnished the animus for ordaining her retirement.

Now we might as well make up our minds to it, women are going to secure and hold some of the responsible offices.

Some of these women will be of the angular, raw-boned type that are intensely fond of making trouble and meddling.

The delicate, gentle, efficient woman, who combines dignity with ability, isn't much of an agitator as a rule.

When we are fortunate enough to get one of this type in office, and she makes good as Fern Hobbs has done, she should be encouraged. We all ought to help her stay, instead of sneering at her sex and plotting her downfall. Instead of attacking her just because she is a woman, we ought to help her because she is a woman.

We can't cut out all of our prejudice against meeting women in public positions—it does jar a little—but we'll get used to it gradually, just as we are accustomed to women in business offices.

When a woman succeeds under all the handicap her sex imposes she is entitled to more praise than when a man succeeds. When she is a womanly woman, distinctly feminine, we ought to exert ourselves still more to be of service to help her achieve her career.

Fern Hobbs isn't going to get out and make a big fuss. But you'll find people all over this state who feel deeply on the subject of her undeserved retirement, and the little woman may be a big issue before many years roll round.

Advertisement for Sewer Construction

Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock p. m. May 12, 1915, for the construction of an eight inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak street trunk sewer, midway between Seventh and Eighth Streets, and running thence easterly across Block 1, across Pine street, and 168 feet into Block 2, all in Hackleman's Woodland Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 7:30 o'clock p. m. May 12, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$175.00 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of awarding of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said sewer prior to the 1st day of July, 1915, under a liquidated penalty of \$2.50 for each day of delay beyond that period.
