SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.

While, in the European war, there has been some fierce fighting on land, as tropical as anything since the war began, the water game has attracted the most attention. These are more of the character of surprise, occurring suddenly, quick enough to make one gasp. There have been a good many torpedo flights, almost universally disastrous. Nine times out of ten they hit their mark, and that always means trouble. The greatest disaster of the week was the sinking of the Lusitania, off Ireland, with 21 hundred passengers on board. As there were Americans on board this has caused much talk. Before leaving New York, passengers were warned of the danger of the trip, and they went at their own risk. It is not an occasion for trouble, and should not result in anything serious internationally. People going to Europe do so at their own risk. It is simply a gamble game.

Another foreign affair has been a disagreement between Japan and China, resulting in an ultimatum by Japan, and an adjustment of differences between the two brother nations. This was entirely proper. These two people should be in fellowship, not in a quarrel.

This week a Reed College professor, in a cold blooded, scholastic way, declared that President Wilson's foreign policy is out of date, an old thing, not in keeping with the changes of the times. Whatever is a fact as to this, it is a fact that his policy is in keeping with Christian sentiment and good morals, and our country is being blessed in having a man at the head who is able to hew to the line of a policy that is bound to bring this country only good things in the long run.

In Oregon this week there has been celebrated two important events, the opening of the Columbia river to steamer traffic for five hundred or more miles, and the transfer of the locks at Oregon City to the government, making them free. Each in a way will play an important part in commercial matters, the former the most. What the latter will do in fact is something it will take time to demonstrate. Nevertheless it is the proper thing, and is therefore welcome.

A big thing here this week has been the organization of a growers' association, something, if perfected as anticipated, will mean a great deal for this part of the valley.

Dun, the great authority on conditions, continues to report business on the upgrade. The writer has talked with travellers, going out from Albany for Portland houses, who say their business has been improving and that the outlook is better. This may not cover all lines, but it does some.

Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock p. m. May 12, 1915, for the construction of an eight inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak street trunk sewer, midway between Seventh and Eighth Streets, and running thence easterly across Block 1, across Pine street, and 168 feet into Block 2, all in Hackleman's Woodland Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 7:30 o'clock p. m. May 12, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$175.00 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of awarding of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said sewer prior to the 1st day of July, 1915, under a liquidated penalty of \$25.00 for each day of delay beyond that period.
