THE LUSITANIA

The sinking of the Lusitania, a British vessel, by the Germans, is in keeping with the policy of war, the destruction of commerce of all kinds, regardless of consequences or civilization. The war has resolved itself into a conflict of this kind, and it is simply the part of the public to take notice and be governed accordingly. It is an awful system of warfare. Even in so-called barbarous ages non-combatants were respected. Old people, women and children have always been considered worthy of being let alone. In this most barbarous war in the history of the world no one is considered. This does not apply to one side, but to both. It was simply murder to torpedo the Lusitania; but, then the whole war has been a series of murders.

It is an unfortunate thing that there were quite a number of Americans on board; but it was their own fault. They knew the danger. They had been warned. They went in the face of the warning, willing for the adventure of it to take their chances. It was an awful risk; but they took it deliberately. Even as the news was horrifying the world another steamer load left for Europe, and the passengers declined to cancel their tickets. If they play the game they must take the consequences. It is not for the United States to win up in it.

HIGH WITHOUT TARIFF.

It is a striking fact that just now the things that are the highest price are things that are not protected by the tariff for instance, wool, wheat, and potatoes. The demand has done this. It shows that a thing does not have to have a big tariff on it to bring a good price, when there is a demand for the article. It has been asserted continually that the taking of the tariff off an article meant its death.

TIMELY RAINS.

A big rain just at the right time was declared to be twenty dollar pieces. Oregon generally has the rains when needed, in the long run about right, sometimes not quite enough, sometimes too much, but averaging up as near right as such things can be. When the harvest season has come in the Willamette Valley, so far in its history, there has been a good crop, not always just the same; but always enough to mean a big income altogether from the resources of the soil. This year, at the present time it looks a little better than the average.

May 12, 1915, for the construction of an eight inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak street trunk sewer, midway between Seventh and Eighth Streets, and running thence easterly across Block 1, across Pine street, and 168 feet into Block 2, all in Hackleman's Woodland Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.
