ALBANY'S FOURTH SALES DAY.

Albany's fourth sales day will occur next Saturday, one that promises much of interest, not only to those who come for speculation in horse flesh, other flesh, and things generally, but for those who come for the interest of it and the crowd.

For the first time since taking his seat as U. S. senator Hon. Harry Lane will be here and speak. Many will want to hear him. Though young in the service as a senator, he has been taking an active part in the affairs of the office, and is making a good record as an official. His subject will be one of special interest to the people of the Northwest, our natural waterways, something that has been attracting wide attention on account of the recent celebrations in honor of the opening of the Cello canal, and the making of the locks at Oregon City free. While not an orator, Senator Lane is an entertaining speaker and gets down to business in whatever he discusses.

These sales day events have been splendidly managed so far, in a marked manner serving the purpose sought, gradually gaining ground in popularity, looking towards permanency.

FIRST JEWISH GOVERNOR.

Mose Alexander, of Idaho, is the first Jewish governor in the United States. He has been a successful business man, gaining a reputation, not only as a man who does things, but as well for integrity and reliability. His career is an interesting one. He was born in Germany and came to the U. S. when fourteen years of age. He stopped in New York, then came as far as Missouri, locating in Chillicothe, where he clerked. In 1891 he came further west, settling in Boise, where he started a clothing store, which grew into a chain of stores all over Idaho. He was mayor of Boise twice before becoming governor. As mayor he is said to have given the city a good cleaning, applying business methods to the city. He is said to have started in as governor along business lines.

CHANCE FOR PROMOTION.

My friend is now an officer. He writes me he is very glad. You see in the army peace promotion is very slow—you must wait for officers to die. But in war they get killed by thousands."

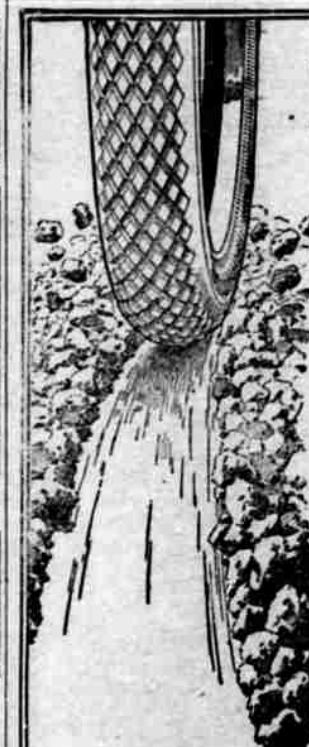

Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock p. m., May 26, 1915, for the construction of an eight inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak Street sewer between Water and First Streets in the City of Albany, Oregon, and running thence westerly across Oak Streets and through the center of Block 8 of Hackleman's Third Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon, and to within 40 feet of the east line of Sherman Street in the City of Albany, Oregon, a distance of 272 feet.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 8:00 o'clock p. m., May 26, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$100.00 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of awarding of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said sewer prior to the 1st day of August, 1915, under a liquidated penalty of \$2.50 for each day of delay beyond that period.
