Announcement Soon to Be Made
 About New Car of Popular Make.

According to J. L. Irvin, local agent for the Buick automobile, his company is about to announce their new car for 1916. In accordance with their past efforts to get into the field first with their new car, the Buick company will announce in the next issue of the Saturday Evening Post their formal announcement of the car. Nothing but six cylinder cars are built this year, and it is understood that they will sell at about the same price as this year's fours, or between \$1025 and \$1100.

Although the 1915 season is no where near over, interest is already being manifested in advanced engineering feats in autos. The Packard people have announced a 12 cylinder car. It is understood that the Overland people also have a startling announcement that will be forthcoming shortly, and other makes will appear from June on.

Although the Studebaker people do not believe in crowding the advance season too early in the year, it is understood that they, too, will spring a few surprises in their next year's output.

What the Dodge will do is a matter of conjecture, but the instant success of their first car leads the public to expect a worthy successor next year. The Ford no doubt will make some minor changes after August 1.
