WANTED IDEAS.

This is an age when ideas are wanted along industrial lines of progress, as well as in war. Oregon now specially needs ideas that will help in the advancement of the state. In Eugene the commercial club has a scheme to get some, told about by the Register as follows, worthy of consideration by towns generally:

The Eugene Commercial club recently inaugurated a plan that is more than usually meritorious. "Idea contests" are to be held at regular intervals and the member who advances the best idea along lines of community promotion is to be awarded a gold button which he is privileged to wear for a certain length of time. Winning this button three times causes it to become the winner's permanent property.

The idea that won the button the first time shows the real merit in the plan. The successful contestant proposed that a "scouting committee" be appointed whose duty it will be to keep track of newcomers to the city and the surrounding country and to report their names at once to the club. A determined effort will then be made to get them "placed" in the city—to make them feel thoroughly at home and to help them adapt themselves to new conditions.

This idea recognizes a new phase of community promotion that is becoming increasingly important. It is no longer enough to get people to leave their homes elsewhere and come to Oregon; we must help them to get settled when they get here. We must not only take individual notice of newcomers but must pay close attention to the opportunities for home-making that are offered.

Oregon greatly needs larger population. The state is too thinly settled. There is too much waste land that needs frugal workers with a little capital. But it is wasted effort merely to bring people from the East and dump them into the Willamette valley to shift for themselves. We must remember that conditions here and in the places whence most of our new population is drawn are essentially different and must prepare to help the newcomer to overcome these differences without financial loss.

It has often been said of the Western "booster" that "he met the stranger and he took him in." Too often he did—in the slang sense of the word. In too many cases the would-be investor has been regarded as game on which there was no closed season.

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and where this has been true the resulting benefit to the country has been small indeed.

The idea that won the Commercial club's gold button gives a new turn to the business of seeing the stranger and taking him in. It is based on sound common sense and it is consistently followed it will result in great good to Eugene and the upper Willamette valley. This country does not want mere temporary visitors; it wants permanent residents. It can best secure them by offering them a cordial reception and real opportunities to become permanently settled.

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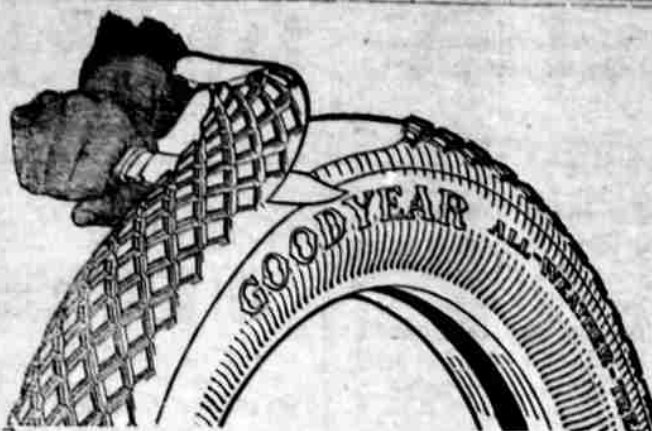
