THE NEWSPAPER.

In an address at Eugene recently Eric W. Allen, at the head of the newspaper department of the U. of O., made some striking remarks along the line of newspaper cleansing powers that deserve notice.

His subject was "The Newspaper of the Future," and he characterized the history of journalism as the "removal of the taboos," tracing the removal of secrecy from preliminary procedure to the star chamber session, and predicting that great, semi-public corporation will be next.

"The newspaper's cleansing power is slightly caustic," he said; "it smartens and stings a little. No body of men has ever been so foresighted as to see in advance the benefits that would ultimately accrue to them through publicity for their acts. Publicity is almost always administered, for the first time of taking, at least, the way the old Spring medicine used to be administered—holding the chin and pouring it down. With experience however, the patient becomes appreciative.

"Civilization has been the great gainer in the end. Where publicity comes in, graft vanishes, pretense is punctured, even inefficiency becomes efficiency and envy, hatred and suspicion, oppression and all uncharitable-ness are succeeded by the nearest approach we have yet achieved to clean consciences and brotherly good will. "A good newspaper wipes the verbal gossip out of a town the way a vacuum cleaner sweeps the dust from the floor. One good 'nosey' reporter who prints exactly what he sees, and who sees a good deal, is worth three preachers. The most inaccurate paper ever printed is reliability itself compared with the cleanest of town gossip. Let a town know that its little occurrences are put on record, by a paper that can be held responsible, and in a way that is not open to suspicion of favoritism, or partisan coloring, and every man's reputation is safe from that day unless he ruins it himself.

"To accomplish all this, however, the editor and reporter must have a great deal of backbone. Newspapers are meant to be read, not to be loved. If your paper does not arouse your ire once in awhile, one of three things is true; there is something wrong with the paper, there is nothing wrong with the town, or, third, you yourself are such a rank outsider that you do not know what is going on."

Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock P. M. June 9, 1915, for the improvement of Main street from the south line of Water street to the south line of Fourth street, in the City of Albany.

Said improvement to be made in the following manner, to-wit:

First: By grading said street to be proper subgrade.

Second: By paving the roadway of said street full width with full intersections with asphaltic concrete pavement on an asphaltic concrete foundation.

Third: By laying and constructing asphaltic concrete headers.

Fourth: By constructing catch basins.

Fifth: By constructing inlets.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe.

Seventh: By laying sub-drain tile.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the said City of Albany, and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 8:00 o'clock p. m. June 9, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract; and provide and approved bond in the sum of \$2,000 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of award of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said improvement prior to the 15th day of October, 1915, under a liquidated penalty for damages of \$25.00 for each day of delay beyond that per-
