SWAT THE FLY.

A live campaign has begun in Albany against flies, and is proposed to push it to the limit, using all manner of contrivances, early and late, persistently, never ceasing. If you do not feel anti-fly pugilistically inclined you will after reading the following prepared by an Albany expert on flies, a member of the local committee:

Each of the fly's six feet is a combination of feather dusters and sponges. The fly crawls out of filth at birth and crawls in sticky filth daily. Between times he wipes his feet in our food and on our faces and buzzes the filth off his wings in the air that goes to our throat and lungs.

An investigation by the Connecticut Experiment Station has shown that the average load of the house fly and the pigpen fly is somewhat less than a million bacteria while the swill barrel fly ordinarily loads up with more than six and a half million bacteria.

If the fly has a purpose in life and if we can read that purpose in his mode of life we must conclude that it is to find all the filth that we let accumulate about us, bring it to us, deposit it in our food, and otherwise feed it to us. He has been our deadly enemy all along and we are just learning his nature and how we may eliminate him.

Five thousand germs of tuberculosis have been found in one fly speck. Typhoid, cholera, tuberculosis, sore eyes, and anthrax are a few of the diseases that flies are all of the time carrying from the sick to the well.

In one year Syracuse, New York, buried 383 children under one year of age at a cost of nearly \$30,000 for the funerals. A fly campaign at a fraction of that cost would have saved the lives of most of these children.

What are the facts that demonstrate that we can easily control the situation and eliminate the fly? Some of them are the following: The fly lives and dies within a few hundred feet of the place where he is born. It is on the wing nearly two weeks before it can lay an egg. It never gets wise enough to avoid a trap, but hurries into any well-baited one. Everybody and every interest in any city can cooperate most heartily, with no conflict of interests, in the fly campaign, paying the way for fruitful cooperation in other enterprises when the brief fly campaign is ended with the end of the fly. The nation is arousing wonderfully to the peril of the fly. A score and more of State boards of health are scattering bulletins broadcast, in anti-fly warfare. Cleveland, Ohio, furnishes experimental proof, being a big city almost without a fly.

Advertisement for Street Improvement.

Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock P. M. June 9, 1915, for the improvement of Main street from the south line of Water street to the south line of Fourth street, in the City of Albany.

Said improvement to be made in the following manner, to-wit:

First: By grading said street to the proper subgrade.

Second: By paving the roadway of said street full width with full intersections with asphaltic concrete pavement on an asphaltic concrete foundation.

Third: By laying and constructing asphaltic concrete headers.

Fourth: By constructing catch basins.

Fifth: By constructing inlets.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe.

Seventh: By laying sub-drain tile. Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the said City of Albany, and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 8:00 o'clock P. M. June 9, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid, to be forfeited in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide and approved bond in the sum of \$2,000 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of award of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said improvement prior to the 15th day of October, 1915, under a liquidated penalty for damages of \$25.00 for each day of delay beyond that period.

The council reserves the right to reject all bids deemed unreasonable.
