Said improvement to be made in the following manner, to-wit:

First: By grading said street to the required grade and subgrade.

Second: By grading said street six inches deep and eight feet wide. Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the said City of Albany, and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the offices of the City Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 8:00 p. m. June 23, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$100 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of award of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said improvement prior to the 1st day of August, 1915, under a liquidated penalty for damages of \$2.50 for each day of delay beyond that period.
