NO OCCASION FOR WAR.

That the trouble between the United States and Germany does not call for war is the position taken by the newspapers generally. The character of the note of the President to Germany is such as to suggest a peaceable solution of the matter. The Telegram, of Portland, deals with the question practically, as follows:

The salient conclusion is that "the government of the United States cannot admit that the proclamation of a war zone from which neutral ships have been warned to keep away may be made to operate as in any degree an abbreviation of the rights of American shipmasters or of American citizens bound on lawful errands as passengers on merchant ships of belligerent nationality. It does not understand the imperial German government to question these rights. It understands it to accept as established beyond a question the principles that the lives of noncombatants cannot lawfully or rightfully be put in jeopardy by the capture or destruction of an unresisting merchantman is in fact of belligerent obligation to take sufficient precaution to ascertain whether a suspected merchantman is in fact of belligerent nationality or is in fact carrying contraband of war under a neutral flag."

The final word, diplomatically but firmly put, is the demand of the United States government that the German imperial government take measures to put these principles into practice in respect to the safeguarding of American lives and American ships, and that it gives assurance of that course.

As we understand the phrase, there is no closing the door in all this. There is nothing in the letter or the spirit of it that need precipitate war. There is nothing about it calculated to put German pride to the test. On the contrary, it is calm, dispassionate, though earnest, appeal to the best there is in German culture—that element which would move German culture and German conscience to right and rational action. The note was written in a mental atmosphere of inflexible purpose in the consciousness that it expressed to the very letter the sentiment of this great American democracy.

Scaled bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 o'clock p. m. June 23, 1915, for the improvement of Pine Street from the south line of Salem Road to the north line of Santiam Road, in the City of Albany.

Said improvement to be made in the following manner, to-wit:

First: By grading said street to the required grade and subgrade.

Second: By graveling said street six inches deep and eight feet wide.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the said City of Albany, and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.

Bids will be opened at 8:00 p. m. June 23, 1915.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five per cent of the aggregate bid, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$100 for the faithful performance of the work within ten days after notification of award of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said improvement prior to the 1st day of August, 1915, under a liquidated penalty for damages of \$2.50 for each day of delay beyond that period.

June 23rd, 1915, for the construction of an eight-inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Ferry Street trunk sewer where same connects with Twelfth Street and running thence easterly along said Twelfth Street, parallel with and sixteen feet from the south line thereof 152 feet to the intersection with the center line of the alley through Block "A" Central Addition; thence southerly along the center line of said alley and the extension thereof 28 feet to a point in the street or road running southwesterly and northeasterly and 8 feet from the northwesterly side thereof; thence southwesterly along said street or road, parallel with and eight feet from the northwestern side thereof 30 feet, and being a total distance of 432 feet.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.
