Sealed bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, until 7:30 p. m., June 23rd, 1915, for the construction of an eight inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Ferry Street trunk sewer where same connects with Twelfth street and running thence easterly along said Twelfth Street parallel with and sixteen feet from the south line thereof 152 feet to the intersection with the center line of the alley through Block "A" Central Addition; thence southerly along the center line of said alley and the extension thereof 254 feet to a point in the street or road running southwesterly and northeasterly and 8 feet from the northwesterly side thereof; thence southwesterly along said street or road, parallel with and eight feet from the northwestern side thereof 30 feet, and being a total distance of 432 feet.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder, where plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained.
