THE CASE OF FRANK.

In the history of the American
courts there has been no case that
attracted wider attention than that of
Leo Frank, charged with the murder
of Mary Phagan, at Atlanta, Ga., who
in the opinion of the masses is inno-
cent; but who was found guilty and
sentenced to be hanged. Now the
governor of Georgia has commuted his
sentence to life imprisonment, caus-
ing further agitation and anger in
that state, where there seems to have
been a movement from the start to
hang Frank anyway.

It is a long drawn out affair. Mary
Phagan was murdered April 26, 1913.
Frank was arrested three days after-
wards, Conley a negro helper, two
days after that. Frank was indicted
in July and in August was convicted.
He was denied a new trial. Conley,
whom nearly everybody believes was
the real murderer, was convicted as
an accessory of the murder. The case
in different forms went to the su-
preme court, with decisions against
Frank. The day for his hanging came;
but the hanging did not come. The
governor met the tremendous
pressure against it and commuted the
sentence. He did well. Eventually
there will undoubtedly be more than
that—pardon.

FOUR B. B. PITCHERS.

Considerable interest has been
manifest in a recent contrast of the
history of four baseball pitchers, set
out in pairs, Mathewson and Plank,
Raymond and Waddle. A sporting
editor, said to be the greatest in the
United States, Grantland Rice, has
discovered something worth listening
to. Mathewson and Plank are now
on their fourteenth season in the big
league, both at immense salaries, and
both with remarkable records last
year. Of the other two, Raymond
was driven from the big league and
was killed in a brawl, and Waddle
is dying penniless, supported by a
former employee. Readers of the Dem-
ocrat do not need to be told the
cause. It was dissipation. When
they started the former had no better
prospects than the latter; but they
ran the straight line and are respec-
ted by the people of the U. S., whether
base ball fans or not, while the others
are forgotten except as examples
of how dissipation will unfit a man
for effective work in any line, whether
base ball or business.

Council of the City of Albany, Ore-
gon, until 7:30 p. m., June 23rd, 1915,
for the construction of an eight inch
lateral sewer beginning at the man-
hole in Ferry Street trunk sewer
where same connects with Twelfth
street and running thence easterly
along said Twelfth Street parallel
with and sixteen feet from the south
line thereof 152 feet to the intersec-
tion with the center line of the alley
through Block "A" Central Addition;
thence southerly along the center line
of said alley and the extension thereof
254 feet to a point in the street or road
running southwesterly and northeasterly
side thereof; thence southwesterly
along said street or road, parallel with
and eight feet from the northwestern
side thereof 30 feet, and being a total
distance of 432 feet.
