**HE KEPT AT IT.**

Over thirty-five years ago the writer saw a big broad shouldered man passing through the streets of Rochester, N. Y., carrying one end of a racing boat between a couple of stations of the city. The man had been down at Chautauque Lake for a big race, and was on his way home. It was Charles Courtney, the greatest oarsman of his day. Today the same man is coach of the greatest crew of the United States. For years as head coach of Cornell University he has brought out a winning crew, rarely failing. The Courtney stroke has become famous. By consistency, sobriety and faithfulness the man has made rowing a science, which in the hands of trained experts spells success in the business.

The man who stays with a thing generally wins out. Persistence is a big element of success along all lines, from Thomas Edison in electricity to the man in the humblest occupation.

**AUTO DANGERS.**

No modern institution is playing a more important part in the doings of the world than the automobile. It has transformed our institutions. Long distances are now short. We are all neighbors. With it all though, is an element of danger that calls for consideration, for regulation and for extreme care. The following figures are of great interest:

One hundred and twenty-eight human lives were lost in automobile accidents in the United States in April.

Two hundred and ten persons were injured, 56 seriously.

Speed cost the lives of five score. Speed resulted in the injury of ten score others.

Twelve cars, moving at great speed, their drivers trying to beat a train over crossings, were hit by locomotives.

Seventy cars, "hitting it up," killed, in every instance human life forfeited.

Records show that 18 pedestrians were killed. In several instances the fault, coroners' juries found, rested on the pedestrian. In the majority of cases, however, the cars crushing out the lives were speeding.

A significant feature of the April record is that many accidents were due to the acts of drivers who had recently purchased machines.

Illinois springs to the front with an April record of 33 killed. This figure includes the Chicago city list.

Pennsylvania witnessed 30 fatal crashes. The list of injured who survived accidents, totals 18.

Seventeen persons killed in auto crashes in Massachusetts.

New York state was the scene of 16 fatalities. The number of injured is high.

Thirteen persons were killed in Michigan—six in Detroit alone.

Seven Ohioans met death, and 15 others were badly injured.

California reports seven deaths and more than a score injured.

Georgia saw two deaths and 12 serious accidents that did not have fatal results.
