THOUSANDS OF SHRINERS NOW ON WAY TO SEATTLE

July 12 Beginning of Greatest
Masonic Event in History
of the Coast.

Seattle, Wn., July 2.—Headed by the Imperial Potentate of the order in his magnificent train of seven coaches, nobles of the Mystic Shrine from all parts of the country are now en route to the Northwest wonderland for their forty-first annual meeting in Seattle.

The Imperial Potentate left New York Thursday, July 1. He will reach Spokane about nine days later and is due in Seattle Monday morning, July 12, to open the big meeting. Fourteen special trains will escort him from Spokane to Seattle and thirty specials are expected to follow. Fourteen specials will come via Portland and Tacoma; and thirty or forty via Bellingham and Everett.

Just what the biggest convention in Northwest annals will mean to this section is indicated by the fact that the bank clearings in Los Angeles, when the meeting was held there, increased \$4,000,000; and one year ago a similar increase was registered at Atlanta, Ga. The Shriners are noted for their love of a good time and their abundance of wealth. Practically all of the nobles and their families will make a 30-day tour of the west and most of them will travel about 10,000 miles before returning home.

The program which Seattle Nobles have arranged for their entertainment has been pronounced the most elaborate in the history of the order. By way of souvenirs, each delegate will be given an expensive smoking set for his den, featuring the totem pole; each band and patrol member will be presented with a desk set, also featuring the totem pole; and the wives of the delegates will receive hand-carved paper knives carved from ivory at Point Barrow, Alaska, by the natives.
