A PHILIPPINE LESSON.
The exhibit of the Philippine Public School at the Panama-Pacific International exposition has attracted the attention of thousands of visitors. Many educators have left this exhibit with the exclamation, "This is wonderful! If this is the result of system, then it is the only system under the American flag. Why cannot we have more of such centralized control in American schools?" Those who have doubted are converted on the spot to the enormous powers for accomplishment which such management brings.

During the sixteen years that have passed since the American occupation of the Philippines, many forms of public service new to America have been tried out there. Some of these, the Postal Savings Bank and the parcels post, for example provided to meet Philippine needs, have perhaps even been the forerunners of the same institutions put into effect later in the United States. There are others; in the Philippines there is an Agricultural Bank, conducted as a branch work of the Insular Treasury, which facilitates agricultural operations by making loans on agricultural securities; the telegraph is operated by the government the same as the postal department, and as a branch of it; there is no such thing in the islands as trial by jury, this being one instance at least in which the constitution did not follow the flag carried by American arms to the other side of the world.

Among the principal features of the school work in the Islands brought out in the exhibit are: the unit system of education with its four years of primary work, its three years of intermediate, and its four years of secondary; the balanced curriculum, embracing academic, industrial, and physical training features; and the differentiation of work for boys and girls throughout the course. The aims are literacy, franchise, leadership, high home standards; the economic aims, the industrial and commercial development of the country.

The large central fact in the entire school administration, and the fact which stands out pre-eminent in the exhibit, is centralization of management. Under the control exercised by the Director of Education, the most remote and widely separated districts may in the shortest possible time enjoy the same benefits as do the more central located communities, and the more backward sections of the country may quickly profit by the experience and accomplishments of more aggressive localities.

DEMAND FOR LEADERSHIP.
"There is a demand in this nation as never before for intelligent, wise leadership," says President W. J. Kerr, of the Oregon Agricultural college, in speaking of the future career of recent graduates. "Neither in the history of our state nor of this nation has there ever before been so great a demand as there is today for men and women who have had the best training and the best discipline for the discharge of the duties of life. With the advantages and opportunities that have come to the college-trained men and women should be assumed by them corresponding responsibilities. They should sense that responsibility, and when they go out from the institution never fail to do anything in their power to show their appreciation to the community, the county, the state and the nation, of the advantages that they have enjoyed. This responsibility should be discharged by rendering service not merely to themselves but to their community, their state, and to the nation."
