Corvallis is all right without the liberty bell. It has J. R. N.

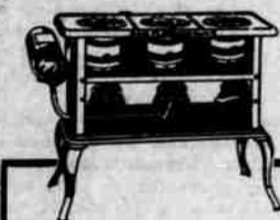
The Oregonian says Bryan has become an unpleasant memory. Wait until he arrives at Portland and see the crowd that will be on hand several hours ahead to see him.
