A meeting of the Maccabees will be held tomorrow, Saturday, night, at the regular hour, W. A. Cox.

Motion to Strike Out—

A motion was filed by the defendant with County Clerk Russell today to strike out certain portions of the complaint in the case of Ada Rozelle vs. W. W. Hawes.

Many Licenses Issued—

For the six months ending June 31, there were 1106 separate hunting and fishing licenses issued, 206 of which were combination licenses. The amount collected in Linn county for that period was \$1106. In the opinion of County Clerk Russell there should be at least \$2600 collected in licenses by the end of the year, for there will be many more issued after the hunting season starts.

Institute to Be Held Here—

Superintendent Jackson announces a joint teachers' institute, Linn and Benton counties, at this city Sept. 13, 14 and 15. It will bring about 400 teachers here. Among the prominent instructors will be the state superintendent J. A. Churchill, and representatives from the O. A. C. U. O. and Monmouth. The work will be in the form of a school for teachers, in departments.

Over 20,000 Cars—

The 20,000 mark has been passed in Oregon. The automobile registration June 31, shows that there were 20,419 cars registered in the state. In May there were 20,588 cars registered, 760 of which were Fords.

Forestry Man Here—

Albert Gillette, of the state forestry department, of Salem, is in the city today compiling some figures from the county records. Mr. Gillette was formerly deputy county clerk of Marion county.

AT THE THEATRES.

"Work" is a riot of fun from beginning to end. Here is what it is all about, though Chaplin's inimitable humor can not be put into words:

Charles Chaplin, assistant to a paper hanger, is called with his boss to decorate a beautiful home. The boss makes him haul the wagon with all their paraphernalia, upon the top of which he rides.

Arriving at the house, they proceed leisurely to work, while the master of the house is clamoring loudly for his breakfast. They daub the rooms indiscriminately with paste and nearly wreck the place. Finally, Chaplin is called to the kitchen to fix a stove which insists on exploding with malicious regularity.

Chaplin succeeds in lighting the gas, accepts the grateful thanks of the family and is about to retire gracefully when there is another blast, shooting him out of the room.

A flirt comes to call on the lady of the house and is discovered by the husband, who pursues him all over the place, shooting his revolver. A butler goes through the floor and pings Chaplin. Both he and his boss are drawn into the mixup.

Finally they all rush down stairs just as the stove blows up completely. The walls of the kitchen are blown out and every buried in the debris. Chaplin opens up the door of the stove, which has fallen over his head, and comes out smiling.
