UNIQUE INSURANCE COMPANY PAYS THEIR FIRST LOSS

Check No. 1 for \$100 has been issued by the Horse Insurance Association of the Forest Service, in payment of the claim of Ranger J. B. Stephenson, stationed on the Cleveland National Forest in southern California. One of Stephenson's horses was recently injured while working with a construction crew of the Forest, and had to be shot. Satisfactory proof of loss was made to association headquarters at San Francisco and payment was promptly made.

This Insurance association is not a government institution, but was recently formed by the Forest Rangers of the California-Nevada district of the Forest Service, for the purpose of distributing the loss that occurs when saddle and pack animals owned by its members are killed or disabled. It is purely mutual in character, funds to pay losses being provided by means of a small quarterly assessment. The amount of the assessment depends upon the losses incurred during a quarterly period. At present over 200 horses are insured in the California-Nevada district, and it is expected that this number will be greatly increased this summer.

AFTER UNCLE SAM'S REMAINING BIG HOMESTEADS

During the last decade, the Forest Service has classified as agricultural and opened to public entry more than 15,500 individual scattered tracts of land in the National Forests, comprising more than 1,700,000 acres, says an article by the chief forester, published in the Year Book of the Department of Agriculture, just issued. Within the last two years, in addition, several large blocks have

been eliminated aggregating more than 2,500,000 acres, while nearly 2,000,000 acres more are now under consideration for elimination. All the remaining agricultural land in the national forests is confined chiefly in isolated tracts scattered here and there; to restricted areas requiring irrigation, where water can not be obtained; and to certain river bottoms and benches which are not covered with very heavy and valuable timber.

A constant pressure is being brought to bear on the government by private individuals who want to acquire possession of these heavily timbered agricultural lands, single quarter sections of which often have a value as high as \$20,000 for the timber alone. In spite of the fact that some of these lands have soil suitable for agriculture, to throw them open as homesteads would not result in farm development. This has been proven over and over again.
