It looks as if he will have to have some judgment knocked into him. As far as the United States is concerned it is doing what it has done right along, watching proceedings, ready for emergencies.

Once in awhile there is a sign of peace negotiations; but it seems to be a house of straw every time.

From over the ocean came a crowd of Australian students, with kangaroo pins on their lapels, bright young fellows, giving entertainments and seeing things. They look a good deal like our boys, sing much like them and have about the same actions. In fact we are somewhat brothers wherever we live, if we think along about the same lines.

In fact you don't have to go away, just down in Bryant's Park, or in almost any direction around Albany. Genial affairs, are picnics, full of off-hand freedom, something worth the time, when sensibly conducted.
