## \$6,000,000 FOR RAILROADS.

A big thing for all Oregon is the proposed railroad between Portland and Nevada down through Eastern Oregon. It is proposed to build four hundred miles, running from Bend to Klamath Falls, via Fort Rock and Silver Lake; from Silver Lake to Lakeview and Warner Valley, via Summer Lake and Paisley, and from Bend to Harney valley, connecting with the line now building south west from Riverside. The total cost will be approximately \$6,000,000. It not only means a good deal for the section interested; but as well for the country, for it speaks for the loosening up of financial conditions generally. It shows that confidence is being restored very fast, railroad operations being a sure index. It is a movement deserving promotion.
