patrons, the dance parlor man-
agers employ well-dressed and skilled
young men to meet this situation.
For the sake of the thrill they get
from the modern and sensuous dances,
many women, some of them of
the richest and best families, trust
themselves to the arms of utter
strangers, and it is there that the
gentlemen of the underworld are to-
day enjoying an advantage they have
never before enjoyed. The dance has
let down the bars."

MOTHER BEST TRAINER.

People often wonder how Coach
Dobie, of Washington University, has
been able to put out a winning foot-
ball team for ten successive years.
There must be a reason. Here is
Mr. Dobie's own reason for his suc-
cess, one worth studying by people
interested in efficiency and methods
of success; though many will disagree
with some parts of it:

"A football player, above everything
else, wants to be normal during the
days of practice. Let him have good,
wholesome home-cooked food and his
own bed. Let him be with his own
family, if he can, and then you will
have him in the best training quar-
ters on earth. Let him live in the en-
vironment he is accustomed to. He
is better with his mother than with a
trainer and, in fact, his mother is the
best trainer in the world. If he is ac-
customed to pie and likes pie and pie
agrees with him, let him eat pie. And
that also goes for pork. If a player
is accustomed to smoke a pipe of to-
bacco between the dinner hour and
the study hour, let him smoke. Whis-
key No. Whiskey is merely an ap-
pendix. It can't possibly do any good,
and, besides, college boys, as a rule,
are not accustomed to whiskey."

"I have figured out and proved to
my own satisfaction," he continued,
"that if I can get the mothers to look
after my players, just as they have
looked after them from the days they
were born, I shall never need to wor-
ry about the physical condition of the
team. But, mind you, a perfect physi-
cal condition of the body, without the
proper condition of the mind, renders
the perfect condition of the body
practically useless."

"I want my players during the prac-
tice days to be good, healthy, normal
American boys, but on the day of the
game they must be something differ-
ent. On the day of the game they
must look upon the college as a patri-
ot looks upon the flag during the
period of his nation's peril. The col-
lege must stand for something worth
while, and on the day of the game
it must stand for the most precious
thing in the world."
