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SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS

The girl is safe who makes every young man associate keep his distance, as she has a right to, and the fellow who gets too familiar should be shipped across lots. Character is too precious to have it jeopardized by contaminating influences. A bad step often means a life of shame.
