EDITORS MEETING AT SALEM IN ANNUAL CONVENTION

Salem, Or., Nov. 5.—Many of the most prominent editors of the state were gathered in the house of representatives, state capitol building, today when the annual convention of the Oregon State Editorial association was called to order by President E. E. Brodie, of Oregon City.

After an address of welcome by R. J. Hendricks, of the Salem Statesman, President Brodie responded and then delivered his annual message.

The appointment of resolutions and other committees was following by a number of addresses pertaining to the business of publishing a newspaper. Among the speakers were A. E. Voorhies, of Grants Pass; Elbert Bede, of Cottage Grove.

This afternoon A. R. O'Brien, of the Record, Marshfield; Professor Allen, department of journalism, University of Oregon; Alfred Holman, editor of the Tribune, Oakland, Calif., and John F. Carroll, editor of the Telegram, Portland, are scheduled to speak.
