SOME THINGS OREGON USES LUMBER FOR IN YEAR

Over a million and a quarter board feet of wood is used annually in the mines of Oregon for props, lagging ties, and ruffle boxes.

Oregon consumes 536 board feet of lumber per capita annually.

In 1914 in the construction of ships and boats at the shipbuilding yards of Oregon and Washington, nearly 13,000,000 board feet of high grade lumber and timbers were consumed. Australian ironbark contributed 35,000 board feet to this total.

To repair the spokes, tongues, and reaches of broken wagon, the blacksmiths and wheelwrights of the towns and cities of Oregon and Washington used over 200,000 board feet of oak, ash, hickory, etc. The average cost per thousand board feet of this raw material was over one hundred dollars.

A new process of creosoting Douglas fir has recently been developed which does not impair the strength of the timber.

DUN SAYS COMMERCE IS GENERAL OVER COUNTRY

Fresh impetus to the forward movement is imparted by lower temperatures in many sections, which stimulate the demand for all classes of seasonal merchandise, notably clothing, footwear and fuel. As retail distribution quickens and broadens wholesale departments in turn benefit and reports from all parts of the country are remarkably uniform in disclosing progressive improvement. Not only does business continue highly favorable in actual performance, but there is every promise, especially in industrial lines, of a degree of expansion limited only by facilities. These are being increased as rapidly as possible in iron and steel, yet though more wheels are turning, there is not sufficient machinery running to keep pace with the rush of new orders, many of which extend far into 1916.

Russians Progressing.

Amsterdam, Nov. 24.—The Cologne Gazette admitted that the Russians are progressing toward Teheran and that American minister is in charge of the abandoned central powers legations.

Italians Have Lost Heavily.

Vienna, Nov. 24.—Half a million Italians have been slaughtered or wounded in the Austro-Italian battle line to date, the war office claimed. The announcement declared that everywhere on the Isonzo "our front is victoriously maintained." Just half a year has passed since the two armies clashed.

Bulgarians at Pristina.

Athens, Nov. 24.—The Bulgarians have occupied Pristina in Eastern Serbia, near the Montenegrin border it is officially announced.

Cruisers Sank.

Petrograd, Nov. 26.—The German cruiser Frankeub sank in the Baltic simultaneously with the Undine, which was sunk by a British sub recently, it is semi-officially stated. The Frankeub carried 275 men and was more than 2600 tons register.
