SAILING TOWARDS MILITAR-
ISM.

The war college asks for a U. S. army of 1,500,000. This would mean a reign of militarism in this country, the domination of the government by the army and navy. Congress should oppose it; but, it is reported there is a big lobby working in the interest of an enormous expenditure for preparedness. Back of the movement are said to be the steel trust and the ammunition makers. Another thing indicating the trend of purposed legislation is a bill by Senator Chamberlain calling for military training for school children.

At the present time the U. S. is facing as big a foe from within as without, and it is going to take level heads to steer the ship past the reefs and through the breakers of militarism, the curse of Europe, father of the present war, enemy of peace and good will.

Prof. C. A. Rexford, of the O. A. C., pays a tribute to Coach Stewart, of the football team, declaring him to be a clean sportsman, teaching his team manliness and sportsmanlike conduct in preference to mere victory. 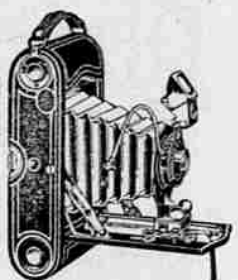
