I look at old Reb Sruel, bent and worn like a reed in the wind; he, too, walks. Occasionally I talk to him.

Night comes. We have been walking for 12 hours. Some have fallen by the road, but we cannot stop, we must walk.

Surah, the feeble-minded one, has just had an epileptic fit. Reb Sruel does not feel well. He is pale; I go to the door to speak to a soldier.

All night we watch Reb Sruel die. We repeat prayers with him. Nobody sleeps. In the morning Reb Sruel is at peace. No more walking for him; the women cry; some of us wish we could take his place.

Some one suggests burial. We are about to ask for the privilege when the door opens and the soldier commands us to get ready to walk.
