THE ALBANY ART CRAFT

STOCKHOLDERS OF HOTEL ALBANY SATISFIED WITH YEAR

Present Management Indorsed
By Relection of Old Board
and Active Officers.

The stockholders of the Hammel Hotel Co., which owns the building occupied by the Albany Hotel, held their annual meeting last evening in the committee rooms of the hotel. The stockholders re-elected the old board of directors, who are commended for the able management of the affairs of the company. The directors are J. B. Thompson, R. D. Snell, C. H. Burgraf, W. A. Eastburn and C. C. Cameron. The directors re-elected the old officers, as follows: C. H. Burgraf, president; C. C. Cameron, V. Pres.; E. D. Cusick, Treas., and J. J. Collins, Secretary.

The report shows that since the opening of the hotel on March first, 1913, the company has earned over \$7000 above expenses. Most of this amount has been put back into the building, the sixth story of the structure having been finished last year and other betterments made at other times. Last year the earnings were about \$2275.

The hotel was built at a cost of about \$80,000, and something over \$1000 was spent on lighting fixtures and office furniture. There are 26 stockholders who have paid in about \$42,000 on capital stock, the balance of the investment being held on a mortgage on the building.

The stockholders are very well pleased with the investment, and the Hotel Albany is today considered one of the best paying hotels in the state. Satisfaction was expressed at the management of the hotel by B. R. Westbrook, who is the present lessee
